Reflections with Your Rector

Happy Easter, Friends! Let your Alleluias rise, let your hearts be raised high. Christ the Lord of Life is risen!!



It was a great Holy Week and Easter with you all. We have journeyed through the lows and highs of life, with Christ our God. The path of Jesus, emptying himself even to death at the hands of people he came to love and save, leads us with Christ Jesus on the journey of resurrection that breaks the power of death and hell by entering them, emptying them, and raising all with him to new life.

Thank you to all who sang, read, prayed, welcomed people, made the space beautiful, and provided hospitality. And to all who came to all the services through Holy Week, I am so glad you now know the power of this spiritual journey through the tender intimacy of Maundy Thursday, the sorrow and grief of Good Friday, and the rising joy of the Great Easter Vigil. As many of you have said, the Vigil is "the most amazing worship service of the whole year!"

And now, we are in the joy of Easter Season — 50 whole days of celebration of Christ's resurrection. Jesus appeared in different times and places to his beloved followers after his resurrection — sometimes in very personal ways, other times with groups. gatherings to offer together at North Idaho College, on our grounds, and in our buildings. There are opportunities to write our history as a congregation. There is the faithful work of seeking and engaging in courageous conversations with others. And there is the opportunity for St. Luke's together to set plans in motion for an exciting and compelling year of ministry through the coming fall, winter, and spring.

Just as Heather and I are working hard to set clear plans for our travels and our encounters in Spain, Morocco, Tunisia, Albania, Macedonia, Greece, and Turkey, I am also working hard with our vestry to set clear goals and opportunities for St. Luke's through this Summer.

The journey Heather and I take this summer will bring us back to places we discovered in the first weeks of our marriage during our honeymoon – and will take us deeper into the meaning of those places. Our journey will also take us to new places we did not know existed. Relying on paths charted by others, we are stepping into territory unknown to us, knowing that we will be stretched and enriched. We will rediscover moments of harmonic history between religious traditions, experience sacred places revered today by Jews, Muslims, and Christians alike, and learn from current interfaith cooperation efforts to strengthen public life and build a future together.

Why Do We...?

Why do we pray like we do in the Prayers of the People?

In the Prayers of the People (usually after we say the Nicene Creed together), we bring before God our cares and concerns for the world and its creatures and people. During Easter Season, we bring to God our thanks and praise for the good we see and experience in the world.

This is not the only time we pray. Each of us individually prays to God. We pray in our families. We pray in pairs and small groups with each other. But there is something powerful about our praying together.



The Prayers of the People are not just the prayers of one person said on our behalf. We pray these prayers together with the person leading us. In most ways of praying together, the congregation speaks part of the prayers — maybe in a repeated cry to God, or maybe in sentences that complete a prayer.

Our Prayers of the People always carry us through big categories of prayer. We always pray for the universal Church around the world and in our own country and region; for our own congregation and its spiritual life and ministry; for our nation and its leaders and people; for the world, in all its beauty and brokenness and need; for our local communities; for people who are sick, suffering, in need, or in trouble; and for those who have died.

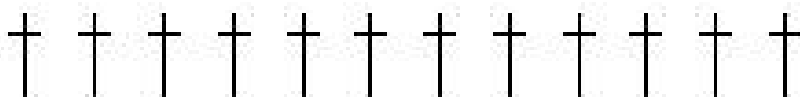

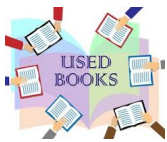

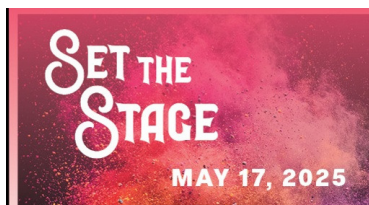
For March's offering we delivered three wagon loads of items to Spirit Valley Food Bank in Spirit Lake.

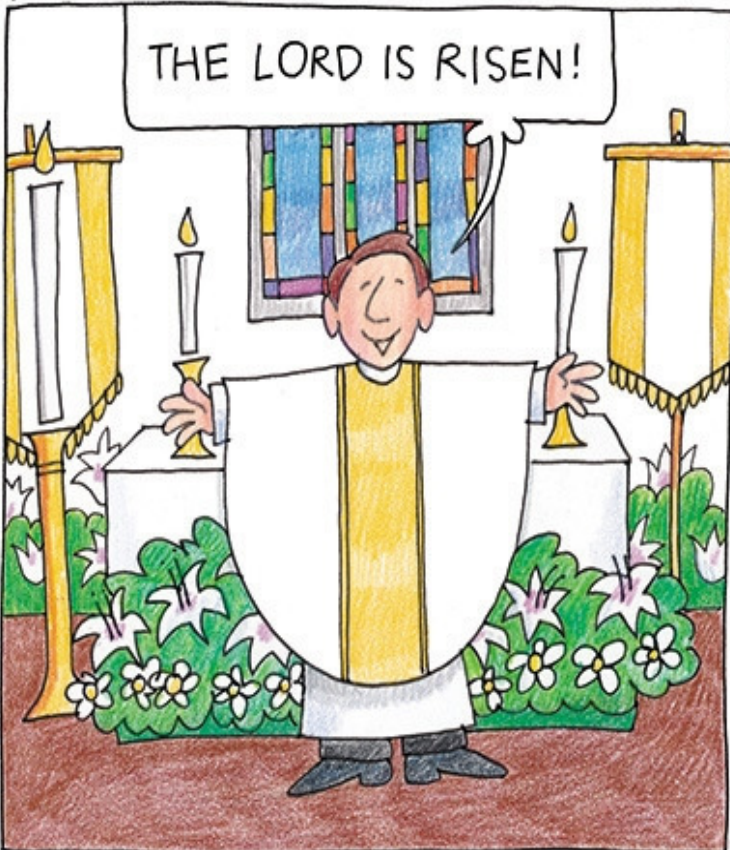

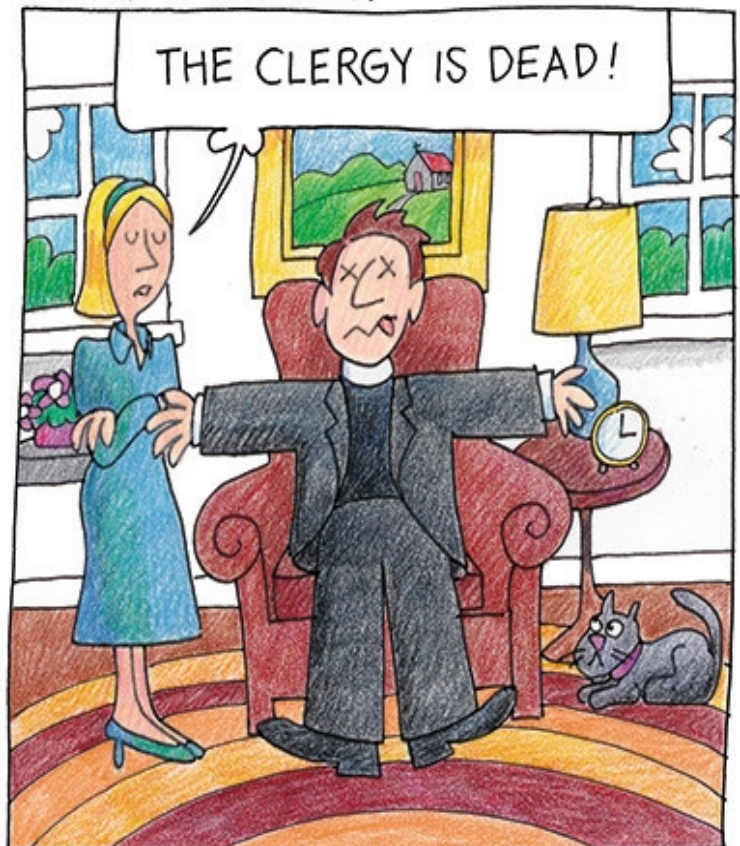
